**Plans Available for Review for Monterey Road Bridge Replacement Project**  
*Bridge to be replaced as part of Public-Private Partnership*

**Harrisburg, PA** – The community is invited to review plans regarding the replacement of the Monterey Road bridge over Mill Creek in Leacock and Upper Leacock Townships, Lancaster County. The bridge is included in the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation’s (PennDOT) Rapid Bridge Replacement Project. The plans display will provide important information, including the construction schedule and traffic changes that are planned to take effect while the bridge is being replaced.

**Bridge:** Monterey Road (State Route 2045) bridge, spanning Mill Creek in Leacock and Upper Leacock Townships (JV-280)

During the bridge closure, drivers will be directed to follow a detour along Route 772, Newport Road, Route 340 (Old Philadelphia Pike), North Ronks Road and Church Road.

**Location:** Upper Leacock Township

**Dates:** February 5 through February 16, 2018

**Hours:** Monday – Friday from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

A letter announcing the start of construction will be mailed out two weeks in advance to all project stakeholders. Interested individuals, groups and organizations will be given the opportunity to sign up as a project stakeholder during the plans display period.

This bridge is referred to as JV-280 and is one out of 558 bridges being replaced under the Rapid Bridge Replacement Project. JV references the joint-venture partnership between Walsh/Granite, which is leading construction for the entire project.

The Rapid Bridge Replacement Project is a public-private partnership (P3) between PennDOT and Plenary Walsh Keystone Partners (PWKP), under which PWKP will finance, design, replace and maintain the bridges for 25 years. The P3

approach allows PennDOT to replace the bridges more quickly, while achieving significant savings and minimizing impact on motorists.
